Transforming the Heart of Campus

The Center for the Dominican Experience will be housed in a renovated and revitalized Archbishop Alemany Library. The two-story facility will incorporate centralized student service offices, smart classrooms, conference rooms, a digital portfolio lab, a spacious learning commons and art gallery, and a new outdoor learning plaza.

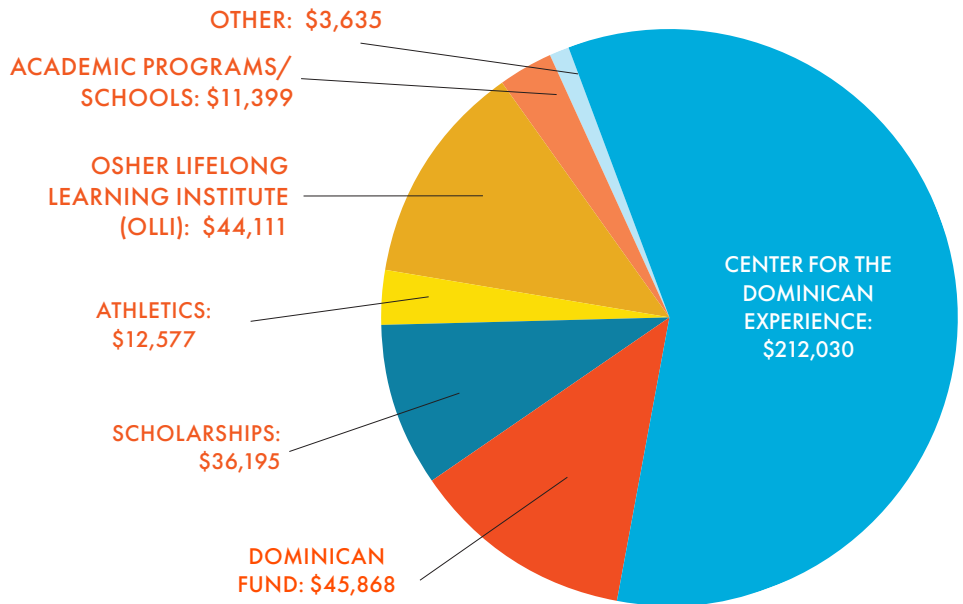
